COMPONENTS OF VISION



PURPOSE

Purpose is the reason behind the existence of a person or thing.

Why am I on earth?

Purpose answers the question "WHY?"

- John 1:22-23 NKJV [22]
- John 8:25 NKJV [25]



VISION

Vision is what a person want to become which is derived from your purpose in life.

Vision answers to the question "WHAT?"



MISSION

Mission is the action plan that must be taken or done by a person to achieve the status, purpose and vision.

Mission statement answers to the question of "HOW"

It can be itemized or listed; it is usually derived from vision statement.



Luke 4:18-19 NKJV [18]

GOAL

Goals are specific action steps that an individual must take in a short, medium and long term to achieve the mission.

Goals are guided by the rule of **SMART** which is not needed in mission statement.

Things to know about vision

- Vision is a clear picture of the future a person paints for himself (vision is the art or power of imagination)
 Joseph [Genesis 37:7 NKJV [7]
- Vision is an internalized clear mental image of a preferred future based on God's inspiration and revelation.
 Genesis 15:5-6 NKJV
- Vision is the capacity to believe what others cannot see and begin to prepare for it.
 Genesis 6:14 NKJV [14]

- Vision is a function of the heart, it is invisible and the invisible controls the visible Romans 4:17 NKJV [17]
- Vision can be specific (personal vision) or collective/corporate
 - a. Specific
 - Noah [Specific assignment to build an ark Genesis 6:13-22]
 - Jonah [To preach to Nineveh Jonah
 - Paul [Made apostles to the gentles Ephesian 3:8 Romans 11:13]

b. General/Collective: Acts 13:2 NKJV [2]
